ALA Scholarship Recipients: Where are They Now?

'Army brat' childhood brings perspective on big picture

Jake Nikkila spends his days working at the U.S. Department of Defense, studying how chemicals in the body of service members respond to high stress situations, in an effort to better the rehabilitation process for veterans.

Nikkila serves American heroes in a unique and instrumental way, and he had no shortage of inspiration in doing so.

His grandfather served in the U.S. Navy, and his father, still active duty, served most of Nikkila's childhood. Though moving every few years could be seen as an obstacle for many people, Nikkila credits it with helping him become more social and adaptable, as well as teaching him important life lessons.

"I think being an Army brat really gives you a lot of perspective on life and the big picture," Nikkila said. "Being able to learn what's important, it's not just about yourself but helping society and the world."

But one obstacle Nikkila didn't expect to face as a result of his military upbringing was paying out-of-state tuition for college. Having just moved, he didn't qualify for in-state tuition anywhere, meaning any college he chose would be thousands of dollars more than if he had lived in the state for two years before attending.

Though this gave Nikkila more freedom in his choice of school, he knew it would come with a major price tag – that's why he went looking for scholarships. Luckily, he had attended American Legion Boys State in high school and was given a list of scholarships he could apply.

He applied for and received the American Legion Auxiliary Children of Warriors National Presidents' scholarship in 2015. It was the largest scholarship he received and made a sizable dent in his first year of tuition at Clemson University.

"It was such an honor to receive this scholarship," Nikkila said. "I thought it was a long shot, but the money upfront really helped me get through."

Nikkila graduated in December 2019 debt-free with a degree in biochemical engineering, concentrating in biomaterials and minoring in physics.

Over the years, Nikkila and his family members have received lots of support from The American Legion Family. He credits scholarships like those offered through the American Legion Auxiliary for helping him be able to follow his dreams.

"I just want to say 'thank you' to those who donated; that means the world to me,"

Nikkila said. "It was four years of making ends meet, but I got through it, and I hope to
eventually give back when I am able."

For now, he plans to give back to our nation's heroes through his career.

"While I didn't choose the military route, I still chose a route in bioengineering that I can use in some way to give back to the world through research and innovation," Nikkila said. "Scholarships like this make that happen."

Fifteen scholarships, in the amount of \$5,000 each, will be awarded for 2021. Three scholarships will be awarded in each of the five divisions of the American Legion Auxiliary. All are gift scholarships; not loans.

RHLES

- Candidates for this award shall be daughters, sons, grandsons, granddaughters, greatgranddaughters, or great-grandsons of veterans who served in the United States Armed Forces during eligibility dates for membership in The American Legion: April 6, 1917, to November 11, 1918; and any time after December 7, 1941.
- 2. Applicants must be in their senior year of high school.
- 3. This is a scholarship to attend an accredited institution of higher education.
- Applicant must complete 50 hours of volunteer service within the community during his/her high school years. Hours must be verified in writing by the recipient organization(s).
- Applicants must present the completed application to their local American Legion Auxiliary Unit President ON OR BEFORE MARCH 1, 2021.
- 6. Judging, at all levels, shall be on the following basis:

 Character/Leadership
 25%

 Essay/Application
 25%

 Financial Need
 25%

 Academic Achievement
 25%

THE DECISION OF THE JUDGES SHALL BE FINAL,

7. The award will be paid directly to the school for the first semester upon notification from the school that the student has registered. American Legion Auxiliary National Headquarters must receive certification of enrollment within 12 months of a winner's notification or the scholarship will be forfeited. The scholarship must be used within 24 months of the date the winner receives notification by National Headquarters, or the scholarship will be forfeited. Thus, if the winning student does not wish to use monies for FIRST-YEAR expenses, it must then be used for SECOND-YEAR expenses or forfeited.

Veterans in Virtual Community Schools

The American Legion Auxiliary has a long history of collaborating with its schools for the Veterans in Community Schools program. As Auxiliary members, we can promote this program in the current virtual learning climate. It is never too early in our students' education for them to learn the history, accomplishments, and stories of our Veterans. By seizing this opportunity to record our Veterans' actual words and artifacts, we accomplish the Auxiliary mission and allow future generations to learn about Veterans visually.

In expanding this program to include virtual recording, this will allow not only our Veterans in the community but also our Veterans in the Veterans Administration's hospitals and extended care facilities to participate in this program. The Auxiliary collaborating with the Legion family will make this a very successful virtual learning experience. There are multiple approaches to procuring Veterans to participate in the program. As Auxiliary members, we have constant contact with family members who served our country, Legionnaires, and other Veteran service organizations; ask them to record their stories. These can be our World War II Veterans who would love to record their stories, and these are stories that should be recorded for future generations of students. Lastly, many of our students desire more than what is taught in schools to expand their knowledge of history. These students have a passion for hearing stories directly from our Veterans to understand the realities of war better.

All that the Virtual Veterans in Community Schools requires to be successful is a Veteran and computer, laptop, or phone with audio, video, and internet capabilities for Google Meet, Zoom, or any other virtual means. During this COVID-19 pandemic, virtual classrooms for kindergarten through 12th-grade students are now the norm. Veterans' virtual visits to the classroom allow students to listen to their stories illustrated with the Veteran's pictures, scrapbooks, letters, and medals. Additionally, the Veteran can see the students, answer and ask questions, and hear the students' comments while being recorded for viewing by other classrooms and future generations.

Work with your schools to incorporate a Virtual Veteran in the Community Schools with a Veterans Oral History Project. Provide the schools with the information from the Library of Congress Veterans History Project (www.loc.gov/vets/) for students in 10thgrade and above. The project website provides sample interviews, scripts, release forms, background resources, and ways to establish a website to showcase the students' work. Following the project's guidelines, a student's interview submission may be placed in the project's database. Also, collaborate with schools in your community to virtually incorporate the History Channel's Take a Veteran to School Day (www.history.com/teacher-resources), a popular HISTORY® initiative, which "encourages schools to connect veterans with young people to hear their stories of service and learn more about Veterans Day. These events can range from a simple one-class visit with veterans to an all-school assembly. Register for this free program and view sample agendas and a wealth of free curriculum resources".

Our world is continually evolving; however, it is our history from which students will learn how to lead our country into the future. Veterans can inspire our students and will provide the knowledge the students need to involve themselves in service to our country and our Veterans, which will last throughout their lifetime and help grow our organization. Through our service, students, parents, and the community learn who we are, what we do, and why we matter. Members participating in Virtual Veterans in Community Schools within their communities are building awareness of the mission of the American Legion Auxiliary while also serving as brand advocates.

Christmas Tree Safety

As you deck the halls this holiday season, be fire smart. A small fire that spreads to a Christmas tree can grow large very quickly.

Picking the tree

Choose a tree with fresh, green needles that do not fall off when touched.

Placing the tree

- Before placing the tree in the stand, cut 2" from the base of the trunk.
- Make sure the tree is at least three feet away from any heat source, like fireplaces, radiators, candles, heat vents or lights.
- Make sure the tree is not blocking an exit.
- Add water to the tree stand. Be sure to add water daily.

Lighting the tree

- Use lights that have the label of a recognized testing laboratory. Some lights are only for indoor or outdoor use.
- Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections. Read manufacturer's instructions for number of light strands to connect.
- Never use lit candles to decorate the tree.
- Always turn off Christmas tree lights before leaving home or going to bed.

After Christmas

- Get rid of the tree after Christmas or when it is dry.
- Dried-out trees are a fire danger and should not be left in the home or garage or placed outside against the home.
- Check with your local community to find a recycling program.
- Bring outdoor electrical lights inside after the holidays to prevent hazards and make them last longer.

FACTS

- More than one of every four home Christmas tree fires is caused by electrical problems
- Although Christmas tree fires are not common, when they do occur, they are more likely to be serious.
- A heat source too close to the tree causes one in every four of the fires.

I hope everyone has stayed safe & well, but some have been hit hard. Hurricanes and wildfires have caused a great deal of damage this year, and there is no shortage of Auxiliary members facing disaster. It is times like these when the Auxiliary Emergency Fund is the difference between suffering and survival. Donate now to the AEF and ensure your fellow Auxiliary members are never alone in their time of greatest need. If you have been affected by a disaster, apply to the AEF, and get the assistance you need.
