I realize the directives to not gather have affected a great deal of your plans but remember there are things we can do without direct contact. Phone calls, text messages and messenger services in social media don't add any danger to anyone. Continue checking on our veterans, members and others in your communities.

It is always my desire to be positive about everything and inclusive not exclusive to anyone. Since late last fall, the membership team and I have been making phone calls, sending emails, cards and letters to our members who have not yet paid their dues. We have found, because they have proof, most of these members have paid their dues but they have not made it to the department. Some are as far back as July. This is unfair to our membership. Setting aside that we are NOT supposed to hold membership, these members appear as if they have not paid their dues and we are in a pandemic. We must do all we can to ensure our members do not lose their ability to receive, if eligible, Auxiliary Emergency Fund grants. Our members trust the remit to person in our units to handle our funds appropriately. This is, unfortunately, happening in all districts. We are asking each of you to help ensure the dues for your unit are getting to department. We have had communications with national due to members not being happy about the situation so let's do all we can to rectify it. If you have not paid your dues yet, you can do so by mailing a check or money order to your unit membership person, pay by phone with National or pay online at www.alaforveterans.org. For those responsible for submitting membership, please ensure you are sending it to our Department headquarters, not to our National headquarters. If you did not change your dues amount when our dues increase happened, the minimum senior dues are \$22.00 and junior dues are \$5.00, all of which is to be sent to our Department Headquarters. Sending less than this amount will result in a delay while our secretary communicates what you need. Hopefully all of you have the transmittal forms. We do have a lot of new people working membership so don't hesitate to assist them in this process.

Unfortunately, we are unable to have our Spring Conference. Many turn in year end reports, history books and poppy displays there. Please put your reports and history books in the mail to the proper chairman or if you have it electronically, email EACH chairperson their report. Also keep in mind Department officers, Chairman and District Presidents should all work on your year end reports so they will be in the book of reports. Our secretary will give us the due date, but it never hurts to start early. District Presidents all your units do some things so please ensure you collect reports from all units. For our units, it is okay if you know an event is going to happen to include that in your report to your District President. We all look forward to reading your reports and for watching units and districts receive awards at Department Convention.

Since we don't know when we will be able to have unit meetings (unless you're doing them electronically), we encourage you to think about diversity in your unit, district and department leadership. We have a lot of young members. We also have some male members. As a twenty-two-year-old attending my unit meetings I often felt left out. I was told to watch and learn, and I was too young to be a leader. Today that tone could have a different outcome. Encourage our younger members and mentor them. After all, we do always say they are our future.

Lastly, I have tried to make it to all districts. Like your plans, mine changed as well. May will be quite busy but if we can have meetings again by then, I will attend Districts 4, 6 and 9 for sure. Also, I have asked Commander McKinney if he can set something up in the 11<sup>th</sup> District. We don't want this year to go by without visiting that district and meeting members there. Please don't forget your VA&R assessments, your Department Operating Assessments and any other donations you make to Department.

# AMERICAN LEGION AUXILIARY DEPARTMENT OF KENTUCKY 99th ANNUAL DEPARTMENT CONVENTION 2019

#### CALL:

The 99th annual Convention of the American Legion Auxiliary, Department of Kentucky, is hereby called in conformity with the action of the American Legion, will be held in Louisville, Kentucky, June 18, 19 and 20, 2020.

**PURPOSE:** The Convention is called for the purpose of electing officers for the ensuing year, for amending the Constitution and Bylaws if properly proposed; Standing Rules; electing **DELEGATES and ALTERNATES** to the National Convention, receiving reports of Department Officers, Chairmen and the Committees, and for transaction of such other business as may be properly brought before it.

**REPRESENTATION:** Representation to the Convention will be by **UNITS.** Each Unit shall be entitled to two (2) Delegates and two (2) Alternates plus one (1) additional delegate and alternate for each twenty-five (25) members of a major fraction thereof, whose dues for 2020 have been received by the Department Secretary prior to June 2, 2020.

All Past Department Presidents, by right of office, shall be delegates-at-large to the Convention with vote, said vote to be cast with her respective Unit.

Alternates will have the power to vote **only** in the absence of delegates. Alternates shall have all privileges of delegates except voting. The delegates and alternates shall be elected by their respective **UNITS** at least two (2) weeks before the Department Convention and written notice of their election forwarded immediately to the Department Secretary on the form provided.

# NO UNITS WITHOUT REPRESENTATION SHALL BE VOTED BY PROXY

**CREDENTIALS:** The chairman of the Unit delegation shall bring a copy of the list of the elected delegates and alternates and shall deliver the same to the Chairman of the Credentials Committee when registering.

**RESOLUTIONS**: All Resolutions for consideration by the Convention shall be submitted to the Resolutions Committee. Any change in the Department Constitution and Bylaws shall be submitted to the Chairman of the Constitution and Bylaws Committee, **No Later Than Wednesday**, **June 17**, **2020**, in order to be presented to the Executive Committee at its' meeting **Thursday**, **June 18**, **2020**, at **7:30** p.m.

#### Legislative Bulletin for April

Thanks to all that attended the DC Conference this year. We had 23 members of the American Legion Family in attendance in Washington DC and most of those were able to storm the hill to fight for our veterans and their family's rights!

Thanks to Tim Martinez who coordinated the event and appointments. He did an awesome job!

Some of the items on the American Legion Legislative Agenda are:

<u>Toxic Exposures and Burn Pits</u> – Millions of veterans were exposed to airborne toxic hazards during their service as a result of burn pits. The American Legion is supporting measures to recognize this and add benefits for adverse health conditions related to this exposure.

<u>Healthcare for Women Veterans</u> – The VA must continue to develop and expand healthcare services for our women veterans. They need more specialized care and facilities.

<u>Support VA's Suicide Prevention Efforts-</u> An estimated 20 veterans die by suicide every day. There needs to be more mental health care professionals and property staffing.

Other items just as important are:

Protecting the American Flag, Pay the Coast Guard, fully Fund a Superior National Defense, Protect the GI Bill, Help End Veteran Homelessness and Support the Gold Star Families.

National Headquarters Update

Things are changing so quickly and so many questions are arising that I decided to send a mid-week update this week. I'm including Department Presidents and Department Secretaries on this briefing to facilitate rapid communication.

Questions are coming up regarding the possible cancelation of district and department conventions and what that means regarding elected officers. Please check your Constitution and Bylaws first for guidance. The National C&B states (highlighted for your convenience):

Section 2. The National Convention shall elect the following term- limited national officers: National President, National Vice President, National Division Vice Presidents, National Chaplain, and National Historian. Each National Division Vice President shall serve without seniority. Such officers shall serve for one (1) term or until their successors are elected; a term shall start upon adjournment of the convention at which they are elected and end at the adjournment of the following National Convention.

So, if the National Convention were to be postponed (and that is NOT being considered at this time), the current officers would remain in place until such time and election could be held. Please also look to your C&B to see if the convention can be held in an alternative format. If your C&B is silent on the topic, or even if it has a clause, check your state law for any limitations on convention format.

Update on NHQ staff: We are following the CDC, state and local advisories and policies, and the Legion's leniency on work schedules. Many staff are working from home, but the building is still open for business and we are conducting business as usual. We are asking members to refrain from visiting us in person for the next few weeks. Those who are out of the office have forwarded their phones and have access to email so I doubt many members will even realize the difference.

In these uncertain times, anxiety can rise just because we are planners and now, we can't really plan as things are changing so quickly. This is a great opportunity for us! We can do a hard reset and question everything we've always thought of as absolutes. We can get creative and adapt to a changing environment. For us at NHQ, we are taking this opportunity to test different online meeting options.

In addition to the change in our physical work environment, this pandemic has forced us to slow down. We all now have space to take a collective deep breath, reconsider our absolutes, and allow creative ideas to flow.

Please, allow those ideas to bubble up and write them down! Maybe you have ideas on how to make convention better, or a form easier to read, or a process to be more efficient. Write those ideas down and share them. This is truly the time to time "outside the box" and take the American Legion Auxiliary into the next century of service!

SUBJECT: KIDS ARE HEROES 2

**HERO:** The dictionary describes a hero as someone who is noble and brave, and has exceptional courage, nobility and strength. That is what we can say about our children that have parents deployed and the courage and strength they display during those times.

Our American Legion Auxiliary's Children & Youth program has a project called "Kids Are Heroes 2" or "KDH2" that recognizes these military youth.

There are more than 2 million children that are affected by deployments. There has been more than a 27% increase in deployed families with children since Vietnam. 1 Effects on these children can be devastating. The American Legion Auxiliary members choose to make a positive impact on those children by celebrating and honoring their service.

Some suggestions to accomplish this include:

Purchase "I'm a Hero 2" buttons and distribute them to those children whose parents are deployed. Buttons can also be made saying, "I am a proud parent or grandparent of a military child" that can display a photo of the military member. Stickers can also be made. A template for the stickers is available for download from the Children & Youth page under the Members only section at www.alaforveterans.org.

Certificates can also be made to let the military children know they are not forgotten. Work with Family Readiness Groups and coordinate dates and times to distribute buttons, stickers and/or certificates. Plan a dinner to acknowledge and show appreciation for the kids and family. During the dinner, showcase the Military Child's Table Ceremony.

There are other organizations you can partner with that are concerned with the welfare of children whose parents are deployed. If your Unit or Department is in close vicinity to a military installation, contact Morale, Welfare and Recreation

(MWR) for a listing of activities where you can have a concession or table at the event.

Don't forget that April is designated as the Month of the Military Child. Purple is the designated color as the colors of the military branches mixed make purple! Encourage members to wear purple in support of the kids of the deployed.

Recognizing, supporting and honoring children and youth, particularly our military children, is part of the ALA Mission.

# SALUTE TO SERVICEWOMEN AWARD NOMINATION FORM

Established in 2003, this award has evolved from honoring women veterans to honoring women who are currently serving our country in the U.S. Army, Navy, Marine Corps, Air Force, and Coast Guard – including the National Guard and Reserve components of each branch.

One servicewoman from each branch of service will be recognized at the American Legion Auxiliary National Convention. Recipients attend the National Convention as guests of the Auxiliary.

#### Nomination Criteria:

- A woman currently serving in the U.S. Armed Forces (includes National Guard/Reserve).
- A written narrative or YouTube video that demonstrates exemplary service both in and out of uniform, making her the face of women in the military.
- Servicewoman must be willing to be a guest of the Auxiliary and speak to the general assembly of the American Legion Auxiliary National Convention.
- All nomination forms must be submitted by June 1, 2020.

#### **Next Steps:**

- The nominating person or the servicewoman writes a narrative (750 words or less) or creates a YouTube video (3 minutes or less) that shows the nominated servicewoman demonstrating exemplary service both in and out of uniform, making her the face of women in the military.
- The following form must be completed and submitted by June 1, 2020, to National Chairman Mary Davis. Written narratives should be attached. YouTube video links should be pasted in the box provided on the following form.
