

# American Legion Auxiliary Americanism Newsletter



### Button Flag

Ages: 6+ (younger children will need help with glue gun)

#### Materials:

5x7 canvas panel

Decorative mesh (I used sparkly white) or burlap. Red, white & blue buttons of various sizes and shades (approximately 70 buttons total)

Glue gun & glue stick

**Scissors** 

Tacky Glue


Ruler

Pencil & eraser

Optional: light blue acrylic or watercolor paint & paint brush

#### Instructions:

- 1. If using burlap, cut a piece 7 x 9 and skip to step 5\*
- 2. If painting your canvas panel, use a pencil to lightly draw a rectangle 3 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> x 5 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> centered on the canvas panel.
- 3. Be sure to paint from one side to the other, not top to bottom. (I tried to make mine look like the sky.) Allow to dry completely.
- 4. Cut a 9-inch strip of decorative mesh
- 5 \*Lay your burlap or decorative mesh on your work surface. Flip your canvas panel over on top of your burlap/mesh.
- 6. Doing one section at a time, use your glue gun to attach the burlap/mesh to the back of the canvas panel. Glue the long sides first, then fold in the corners (like wrapping a present) and glue down the short sides. If you are using a hot glue gun, you will want a chopstick or skewer to help save your fingers.
- 7. Trim off any strings and flip your canvas panel over to the front
- 8. You can lay out your entire flag and then glue or glue as you go.
- 9. Place blue buttons onto the upper left area of your canvas. Line them as you wish. Be sure to vary the size and shade of the buttons.
- 10. Add red and white buttons in a stripe fashion. Making sure to keep your buttons within the border you've created.
- 11. Use Tacky Glue to affix the buttons onto the canvas panel.
- 12. Place the button flag into a 5 x 7 frame and display!

# Welcome to the American Legion Auxiliary!

### OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH THE AMERICAN LEGION

The ALA was founded in 1919 to support The American Legion, the largest organization of U.S. wartime veterans. Our mutual purpose is to make life better for our veterans, military, and their families. We work steadfastly, side by side, promoting patriotism and national security while supporting youth and advocating for those who have served our country.

#### **ALA UNITS**

The American Legion Auxiliary unit is where grassroots work of the Auxiliary takes place. There are almost 8,000 ALA units nationwide. At the local level,



The American Legion is called a post, and the Auxiliary is called a unit. All ALA units are attached to a Legion post, taking its name, location, and number (e.g., John P. Hand American Legion Auxiliary Unit 250), but units are not obligated to meet at the Legion post. If the post is no longer active, a unit may continue to function as what's called a widow unit. Sons of The American Legion groups within Legion posts at the community level are referred to as squadrons.

### A note about ALA membership dues

An American Legion Auxiliary member's dues are made up of three portions, representing the three levels of our organization — national, department (state), and unit. The dues amount listed on your renewal notice is a total of these three portions. Membership dues are paid annually and can be paid directly to your unit or by calling ALA National Headquarters at (317) 569-4570, or by logging in to your profile on the national website at www.ALAforVeterans.org and paying your dues online.

The Auxiliary membership year is January 1 to December 31. Members pay dues prior to the start of the upcoming membership year, and many units start collecting dues six months in advance.



What is The American Legion Family? The American Legion Family is comprised of The American Legion, the American Legion Auxiliary, and Sons of The American Legion. The Legion Family also includes American Legion Riders, a program of American Legion Family members for motorcycle enthusiasts. While members of The American Legion Family are individually unique, collectively we are a multimillion-member powerhouse of caring advocates dedicated to service.

### What are the advantages of American Legion Auxiliary membership?

The ALA is a remarkable organization with nearly 100 years of service to veterans and the nation's communities. In addition to the personal gratification

and rewards gained in voluntary service, there are many tangible benefits for members of the ALA. Members receive a complimentary subscription to the Auxiliary's national quarterly magazine and have exclusive access to a wide variety of discount services and supplemental insurance products. Members also have access to free classes, webinars, and trainings through the ALA Academy. The Auxiliary Emergency Fund is a national grant assistance program that provides temporary emergency help to eligible members of the American Legion Auxiliary who have suffered a significant financial setback as the result of an act of nature or other personal crisis.

Members whose dues are current can create an account to log in to the MyAuxiliary area on the national website to update their mailing address, phone number, and email address at any time. For log-in assistance or a name change, email ALAMIShelp@ALAforVeterans.org.

### I paid my ALA dues. Why haven't I received my membership card?

Units are to provide members their card upon payment of dues. Members who renew either online or by phone with national headquarters are mailed a membership card to the home address on file. Members can log in to their MyAuxiliary account online at any time to print a copy of their most current ALA membership card.

#### How do I find my member ID number?

New senior members receive a 'Thank you for joining' email or postcard after they join. Their member ID number is located in the body of the email or on the address label of the postcard. A member's ID number is also listed on the address label of their quarterly Auxiliary magazine. Members can email membership@ALAforVeterans.org to request their ID number. Members will need their ID number in order to create their online profile on the national website.

We know ALA members are playing a big role in supporting the Be the One mission of helping a veteran in crisis; however, tying the phrase into a clever theme is diminishing the power of the words *Be the One*. We understand the ALA tradition of having themes, and we are not pointing fingers, punishing anyone, or assigning blame. But please note that this is a time our members may want to step back from using Be the One as a theme. Remember: This serious topic is not just an ALA focus, but an American Legion Family mission. We would love for people to use Be the One, but only as a stand-alone to really drive the importance of its mission.

ALA National Headquarters has several awareness plans incoming for members, including social media posts, a blog post, magazine story, and discussions at upcoming trainings, so that all levels of the organization are hearing the same message. ### Talking points on how to use the phrase "Be the One"

We know ALA members are playing a big role in supporting the Be the One mission. However, tying the phrase into a theme is diminishing the power of the words *Be the One*. We understand the tradition of having themes and we are not pointing fingers, punishing anyone, or assigning blame. However, our members may want to step back from using Be the One as a theme. Remember: This serious topic is not just an ALA focus, but an American Legion Family mission.

- Be the One is about suicide prevention and awareness.
- It originated as be the one to save one. It's estimated that between 17 and 22 veterans or servicemembers take their own lives each day.
- It's not a catchphrase. It's not a campaign. The American Legion is now calling it a mission.
- It's a mission to destigmatize asking for mental health support, provide peer-to-peer support and resources, and educate everyone on how they can Be the One.
- The American Legion Auxiliary and Sons of The American Legion joined The American Legion to promote the Be the One mission. So, ALA members should follow the guidelines from The American Legion. Go to BetheOne.org to learn more.
- The words "Be the One" should not be use as part of a lighthearted theme, to invite someone to a meeting, or to pay their dues. Uses other than suicide prevention/awareness diminish its power.
- Use of "Be the One" should be reserved for topics related to suicide prevention and awareness.
- The No. 1 issue facing the veteran community is suicide.
- The approved logos for Be the One are subject to the same usage rules as The American Legion brandmark.
- Think of Be the One as a standalone phrase such as "Just Do It" and "Got Milk".

### How can you Be the One?

- Ask veterans in your life how they are doing.
- Listen when a veteran needs to talk.
- Reach out when you think a veteran might be struggling.
- Increase awareness about the veteran and military suicide epidemic.
- Have a list of resources in your area for veterans who may be struggling.
- Spread the word about the Veterans Crisis Line at 988.

### James H. Parke Memorial Scholarship

### General Information

James H. Parke was the first Director of Voluntary Service and the founding father of the Department of Veterans Affairs Voluntary Service (VAVS) National Advisory Committee (NAC).

The James H. Parke Memorial Fund, comprised of VAVS NAC member organizations, was established in 1976 to serve as the non-profit source of funds for a VAVS Youth Scholarship. Organizations, volunteers, VA staff and others continue to contribute to the Fund.

The board of directors of the Fund annually establishes (in the early spring) the amount of the primary award and any secondary scholarships. The Fund communicates such and provides a nomination form to the Director, Center for Development and Civic Engagement (10B2A) for distribution to Voluntary Service field staff.

The scholarships may be used for tuitions and fees, books and supplies and/or room and board or other educational needs purchased through the school of the students' choice. Scholarship winners must use their awards by their 24th birthday. All winners receive detailed guidance concerning scholarship utilization from the Treasurer of the Fund.

### **Nominations**

Each medical center may nominate one VA student volunteer for receipt of the award. Recommendations may be made by any VA staff member who acts as a supervisor of the student volunteer or member of the local VAVS Committee. This recommendation should be discussed with the Chief, Center for Development & Civic Engagement, before submission to the Medical Center Director.

To be eligible, candidates must have completed 100 hours of regularly scheduled VAVS volunteer service during the calendar year prior to September 1; be a student in the 10th grade or above; and have not reached their 19th birthday.

The Medical Center Director nominates a candidate for the award by submission of the nomination form to the President of the Fund by December 31 via email to <a href="mailto:Parkescholarship@amvets.org">Parkescholarship@amvets.org</a>. Nominations received after that date will not be considered.

The nomination form should be completed to reflect the volunteer service and background of the candidate and include: age, years of volunteering, number of volunteer hours, areas of service, and affiliated/supporting organizations, if any.

### Regular Parke Scholarship Form Summer Parke Scholarship Form

Criteria on which candidates are evaluated for consideration of awards include:

- Scholastic Activity
- Dependability
- Fulfillment and acceptance of responsibility
- Personality and pleasantness to patients and staff
- Leadership capability
- Inspiration to patients through service performed
- Appearance

The National Winner receives a plaque and a letter of commitment. This presentation is usually made at the Annual Meeting of the VAVS National Advisory Committee.

### Privacy Act and Release of Information

All personal information contained in the nomination form for the James H. Parke Memorial Youth Scholarship award, as well as any photograph, may be used by the Fund and VA for promotion and publicity purposes. None of the information is required by law and is, therefore, disclosed voluntarily. A consent form (VA Form 10-3203) is available in all medical centers and should be attached to the nomination package.
